

London 20th Nov. 1827

Dear John

I wrote you last Thursday. and wrote Mrs
Markenizer - I have not since been on the wings
to be off - went of snow and bad roads prevented me
However I have made up my mind to leave this on
my return home next Thursday. This day I spoke
to Mr. Montgomerie about your Patents - and
decided him to make a copy of the one made
out by Sir Francis Burton. I shall mention
to the attorney general my expulations about the
other Patents. The Sup. sent all the papers we
sent down regarding the misunderstanding in the
Discharge to Lord Dalhousie. and all he knows
about the business is the general error concerning the
Error which you have seen. Nothing about Mrs. Hayes
affair. Capen observed to a gentleman who boards here
that he wished he never had any thing to do with it - and
that it was not his doing - but that of others - Even his
lawyer expressed to a friend that he thought her in the
