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NOT LONG before his death Henry Sigerist commented that the best memorial to a man was the publication of his bibliography. After his death Genevieve Miller set about the task of compiling this bibliography, which is a testimonial to Sigerist's position in the field of medical history.

The bibliography contains 520 items and is a complete list of Sigerist's numerous published works. They are grouped in four sections: books and monographs; edited works, translations, and facsimiles; papers, addresses, prefaces, reports, and reviews; and editorial work. An Introduction by Erwin H. Ackernecht provides a thoughtful appraisal of Sigerist's writing in the field of medical history. But Sigerist's writing also reflected the wide range of his interests. Dr. Miller has designed an index which is a guide both to the material in the bibliography and to the subjects discussed in Sigerist's many books and articles.

GENEVIEVE MILLER was a member of Sigerist's staff when he was Director of the Johns Hopkins Institute of the History of Medicine. She is currently Assistant Professor of the History of Medicine at Western Reserve University, Research Associate in Medical History at the Cleveland Medical Library, and Curator of the Howard Dittrick Museum of Historical Medicine.
