RON CLARK : this year's producer has had much experience with the Revue in writing music and handling musical direction for past shows. This year, Ron has written all of the music and incidentally has had a song published and recorded by Joan Fairfax which is presently being released. Ron was one of the key instigators in planning an authentic Revue for 1956. He and his partner Ron Wullner hope to be doing much writing this summer for supper club entertainers.

VICTOR KNIGHT; who is our director this year got his theatre start as a student teacher in the Stokely Street Institute on Drury Lane in London, England. While in England he worked on a number of major film productions including the classic "Good bye Mr. Chips". At present Mr. Knight teaches drama for the Protestant School Board, as well as working with C.B.C. television and radio.

JURY GOTSCHALKS and IRENE APINE: This talented couple got their start with the Latvian National Ballet Company, where they soon were offered the leading roles. In 1947 they both came to Canada to organize a school of Ballet in Halifax, which was very successful. In 1951 the Gotschalks joined the National Ballet Co. as leading dancers. More recently the Gotschalks talents have been exhibited on television in Montreal and Toronto.

DICK DIBBEN, our technical director, became interested in the field of technical production upon entering McGill. He spent one year with the Player's Club, and is now in his third year with the Revue. Dick is in 4th year Architecture.

MARVIN JAY, our musical director and orchestrator-conductor, is studying in the Faculty of Music. He began playing the violin at 6 years, and won a scholarship a year later. Marvin studied for 6 years in the London College of Music, and then won a scholarship to McGill. Last summer he made a concert tour of Europe. At present, in addition to his studies and band engagements, he teaches music in High Schools.

BEVERLY BARTRAM, a third year arts student is in her third year with the Revue, this time in the capacity of Associate Producer. She hopes that one day she will find time away from her many activities to appear in front of the audience instead of always working behind the scenes.

CHUCK GARDNER : who is in third year Commerce was assistant business manager of the 1955 Revue "Ye Gods". This year he did a very good job as advertising manager for "Wet Paint".

RON WULLNER, a 4th year civil engineer wrote many of the lyrics for last year's show. This year he is script co-ordinator and worked with Dave Quastel, Lionel Tiger, Bill Feldman, Don Kingsbury, Lionel Segal, Lawrence Cohen and Mitch Klein. He collaborated with Ron Clark in writing all the lyrics for the musical numbers.

CLARENCE BLATT, a fourth year Commerce student is returning to the Revue for his second year as Business Manager. In 1953 he was assistant business manager and has also held various other position around the campus where he has put his business and financial knowledge to use.

BOB ALROD as co-publicity director with KOLMAN KORENTAYER, is in his second year with the Revue. A third year electrical engineer, he still found time to work with Kolman to make this year's Revue one of the most publicized events in the city.

LIONEL SEGAL : has also played in Saul Honigman productions. At present he is President of the radio workshop, and radio and TV publicity director for the Mc-Gill Winter Carnival.

MARGERY KLEIN, our personnel director this year is in her second year Arts. She participated quite actively on the business end of shows in High School and in camps. She was head of Student Productions in Westmount High for one year.

AUDREY ECCLES, our costume mistress this year is in first year arts. Her show business experience has included entertaining at military hospitals and benefits.

SILVIE SHAW entered McGill from Mount Royal High School this year. Her experience in make-up has been quite extensive, included make-up for the Montreal Ballet production last June.

STAN FEFFERMAN who sings and plays three acting roles in this year's revue, has had several years of stage experience. In 1953 he won a talent show and has since played roles in many 'Y' productions as well as in last year's revue. Stan is a 3rd year arts student.

CORINNE COPNICK a fourth year Honours English student has had extensive theatrical experience. Lately she has appeared with the Mountain Playhouse, the English department and the Player's club in McGill. The M.R.T. and Script Theatre have also exhibited her talents. Miss Copnick has been heard many times over the CBC and is presently playing in "Laura Limited".

PEARL SHEFFY studied dramatics in Paris and Israel thus bringing much experience to the McGill stage. She just finished playing Nina in the "Sea gull" put on by the English Department, and at present is finishing her M.A.
