With the name and addresses to the first several pages of Mrs. Roy B. Parnell (Margaret Rank Parnell), who per Ontario marriage records was born ca. 1891 and married to Roy B. Parnell, a telephone lineman, in Lincoln, Ontario on September 6, 1909; she appears again as a widow marrying John Kirkwood in December, 1916. The spotty but interesting miscellany notebook of a Canadian woman who collects a few extracts of reading ("Eli Perkins on Judges"), occasional notes on wages received working (as at a canning factory), records of the occasional boarder, a 3-page list of books in her library (Sherlock Holmes included), some household inventories, notes on sales of jewelry (apparently in partnership with her sister-in-law, Daisy Parnell), an intriguing series of notes that Daisy "went to Hospital on Nov. 30th 1908 at 6:30 P.M. on Mayor Campbell's order" [almost certainly John Samuel Campbell, 1860-1950], followed by the birth of Daisy's baby on December 11 and her release from the hospital on Jan. 4, 1909; a note in ink autograph below that records the birth of Daisy's second child, Thelma Gertrude Parnell, May 8, 1910 in "St. Kitts."
