WHEREAS the said William Routine — as
is alleged, lately died intestate, having whilst living, and at the
time of his Death, Goods, Chattles and Credits, only in the District
aforesaid, by reason whereof, the sole ordering and granting Admi-
nistration of all and singular the said Goods, Chattles, and Credits;
and also the auditing, allowing, and final discharging the Accounts
thereof, are well known to appertain, only and wholly to Us; we being
desirous that the said Goods, Chattles and Credits, may be well and
faithfully administered, applied and disposed of according to Law;
do therefore by these Presents grant full Power and Authority to you
in whose Fidelity we confide to administer and faithfully dispose of
the Goods, Chattles and Credits of the said Deceased, and to ask, de-
mand, recover, and receive, whatever Debts and Credits which whilst
living and at the time of his Death, did any way belong to his Es-
tate, and to pay whatever Debts, the said Deceased at the time of his
Death did owe, so far as such Goods, Chattles and Credits, will there-
fore extend, you, being first sworn, well and faithfully to administer
the same, and to make a true and perfect Inventory of all and singu-
lar the Goods, Chattles, and Credits, of the said Deceased, and to ex-
hibit the same into the Registry of our said Court of Wills and Pro-
bates, on or before the fourth day of April — next ensu-
ing, and also to render a just and true Account thereof, on or before the
fourth Day of July — which will be in the Year of our
Lord, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Nine and we do by
Virtue of these Presents, ordain and depute you Administrators
of all and singular the Goods,
Chattles and Credits of the said Deceased.
