

Brig Demman Cameron arrived 23 Oct 1838
advised the Indrovers at length of the
condemnation & sale of the Duerwan 15 Nov
at same time had an interview with the
Math & Gray who promised me with
their names and readiness to give their
evidence to the impairment of the Tains
action.

Mr Geo Smith on his way to the
Isle called on me, and enquired if I
was employed in the case of the Duerwan
and said he was in doubt of some of
the articles to be sold, but was in
doubt whether the sale was a legal
one - as he considered the vessel
condemnation unjustifiable and should
put in the highest objection - he added
that perhaps he would send her to
be a good sea worthy ship.

Letter rec^d from H. R. Mortimer
dated 3rd Jan 1839 - received about the
20th Feb - and on the 27th took the evidence
of a number of individuals relative to
the seaworthiness of the Duerwan
before Bro's Maack Esq

Advised Mr Mortimer of
the same with copies on the 27th March

Dr Anderson and myself ~~advised~~
a Power of Attorney ^{from Mr Math} by the April
Packet - and about the end of the
month he arrived here himself
