Mr James Dawson,

Sir,

I have received a Letter from Mr Dixon of your place informing me of the Death of Mr William Taylor and requesting me to send over the things consigned to my care by his Father Mr James Taylor who instructed me not to forward them until I had received a Letter from his Son, but Mr Hasard having applied to me at your request, I did not hesitate to send them over to be forwarded to you by the last Steam Boat,

I now feel I have not followed the instructions of Mr James Taylor so fully as I ought to have done, in sending the Box before I had received his Sons Letter, as if I had been informed of his Death before the Boat left, I should have returned it to the Father who is a very poor Man, and I beg to suggest, that if you have not yet parted with the Things, it would be well to return them to me and I will send them back to him by one of my Voyages the first Opportunity,
