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INFORMATION WANTED.

WHEREAS by a decree of the High Court of Chancery, made in a cause. Bruggs against Aitcock, it was ordered that it should be referred to Lord Henly, one of the masters of said Court to inquire and state to the Court whether the testator, Matthew Taylor's great nephew, **WILLIAM TAYLOR**, son of the said testator's nephew, James Taylor, who was the son of the said testator's brother, William Taylor, was living or dead. And if he were living, where he resided; and if he were dead, where and when he died, and who was his heir at law and legal personal representative. And it was ordered that it should be referred to the said master to inquire and state to the Court what other children of the said testator's nephew, besides the said William Taylor, were living at the time of the death of the said testator. And whether any, and which of them, were since dead, and when they died, and who were the respective personal representatives of such of them as were dead. And whether the said testator's nephew **WILLIAM TAYLOR**, the son of the said testator's brother, William Taylor was living or dead; and if he were living, where he resided; and if he were dead, where and when he died, and who was his legal personal representative. Therefore the said **WILLIAM TAYLOR**, son of the said testator's nephew, James Taylor, if living, or if dead his heir at law and legal personal representative, and also the other children (if any) of the said James Taylor, besides the said William Taylor, who were living at the time of the death of the said testator Matthew Taylor, or the legal personal representatives of any such other children who have since died. And also the said testator's nephew, **WILLIAM TAYLOR**, the son of the said testator's brother, William Taylor, if living, or if dead his legal personal representative, are, on or before the first day of November 1839, to come in and make out their respective kindred and representations before the said master, at his chambers in Southampton Buildings, Chancery Lane, London, or in default thereof, they will be peremptorily excluded the benefit of the said decree.

The said testator Matthew Taylor, resided at Le-mington, in the county of Wilts, and died in or about the month of January, 1814, having, by his will, dated the 18th April 1812, given and devised his real estate (after the death of his grand daughter, Sarah Taylor Bruggs, without issue, and which Sarah Taylor Bruggs is a lunatic, and has never been married,) to his said great nephew **WILLIAM TAYLOR**; and the said testator also bequeathed his personal estate, (after the death of the said Sarah Taylor Bruggs, without issue,) unto the children of his said nephew James Taylor, (except his great nephew William Taylor,) and also to his said nephew William Taylor. The said testator, by his said will, stated that he believed his said great nephew **WILLIAM TAYLOR** resided in Nova Scotia, or some part of North America.
