Dear Sir

I had a letter from Mr. Fox that had gone on to  
Waltham and which I did not receive in time to  
Reply by last mail by which I find he is desirous  
of putting his deed on Record such you when any  
thing that is necessary about the Release from Mr. Curran  
and the payment of the money is arranged to hand the  
deed to him. When I was in person he spoke of being  
prepared to pay the Balance (on which no interest is due  
until the 28<sup>th</sup> April 1846). I mentioned to him that  
I was not wanting the money until the 8<sup>th</sup> Sept  
Should he pay it over however at the time of  
relieving the deed you may just pay it to my  
credit in the mean time as it will suit me  
at the time above mentioned - at Mr. Foxes  
Request last fall I obtained from W. Campbell  
a letter authorizing Mr. Gould to fix the Boundary  
between W.C. and himself that being done I thought  
all differences about Lines would have been ended  
but from Mr. Foxes Letter it appears otherwise  
when I sold Mr. Fox the Land I believed myself to  
be possessed of a good title to  $27\frac{1}{2}$  Rods in breadth if not to

one To one Fourth of the Farm this little I have sold  
him and I will thank you to state to him that  
If he has any doubts on that point that I would  
Return him the money advanced them either  
or hereafter be made a party to dispute my Claim  
with my Brothers but was the case otherwise had  
I other parties to deal with I believe I would find  
but little trouble in being put in possession of  
the One Fourth of the Land and I apprehend Mr.  
Fogel will not either. would you be kind enough  
to say to Mr. Fogel that his Letter had gone on  
to William and believe me Dear Sir your Truly
