Montreal, Sabbath Oct 14
J. W. Dawson
1855

Dear Father,

After leaving
you at Halifax I
managed to get Margaret
and the children
settled into a berth
as comfortable as
the ship furnished,
We had a pleasant
voyage to Boston arriv-
ing there on Thursday
morning in time to land

and that all is well with you

Leans and gained

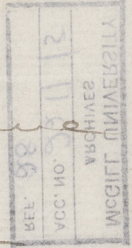
much useful in-

to day to Dr Taylor's P P
Church; he appears a
very agreeable and good
preacher. I should think
quite a superior man. I
have as yet seen no one
and shall write when
I get anything arranged. Mrs
Sweet & the children send
kind love to you and also
to Agnes. I earnestly hope that you
arrived safely at home
