Mr. Dawson

Dear Sir

I received a Note from you a few weeks ago in which was an account against me of 13/9 for the News of the Churches and U. P. Magazine. I enclose to you twenty shillings. I paid for the U. P. Magazine, twice last year and, when I explain how I have no doubt, you will receive one of those payments as payment for the Magazine this year. Last year I paid for the Magazine in advance and have a receipt of that payment dated Nov. 6th 1854. I was in Picton on the

6th day of July and settled
with J. W. Dawson and he told
me the payment of the Maga-
zine was against me. I told
him that I thought I
paid it in advance
but if it were marked
against me and could
not then show the receipt
I would pay it. Accord-
ingly I paid it on the
6th day of July 1855 and
when I went home I found
the receipt for its payment da-
ted Nov 6th 1854. This receipt
I still hold. I trust therefore
that you will regard the
Magazine for this year
as paid. I enclose to you
twenty shillings out of which

you can take the payment
for the "News of the Churches"

I would be obliged to
you if you would change
my address. These papers
still go to Nabon whereas
I now live at Shubena-
cadie.

I wish to pay for the
Eastern Chronicle. Would
you be so kind as to pay
Mr. McDonald & Co if he call
for it and you would ob-
lige me.
