Gent.

Your favor of the 12th came duly to hand, we shall make up the set of the Zoology and forward it, we have heard nothing of the Art Union plates, we wrote Mr. Kidston on the subject but have had no reply. We are glad to find you have made arrangements with Mr. Graham as we find it would be impossible for us to attend to your Boxes and parcels as our time is so much occupied with our own business, we have determined for the future to hand over all goods consigned to our care to a regular commission merchant so that we may lose no time with what is so unsatisfactory and no benefit. Consignments to our care from all quarters have become so numerous of late particularly by the Steamers that this step has become absolutely necessary, unless we employed another person, which we are not disposed to do at present we have sent a box from Phillips for Mr. James McKay which we hope you will receive safe.
