Dear Sir,

We are in receipt of your favor of 20th ult enclosing Bill on London at 3 days St, for Ninety Six pounds 10s, which we have placed to your credit with thanks. We debit you with £3.16/- paid to R Griffin & Co for Maria Zanthan, as per receipt enclosed. The amt. was not included in the former adv. as you formerly requested, we applied to Mr. Kidston to return us one of your subscriptions. He stated that his books were made up for that year, but that he would deduct it from the amt. payable next year, & he further stated, that he was writing you to that effect himself. We have again seen him, & he says that he did write with this explanation, & will again write you, & that he is now sending off the plates, non receipt, of which you complain of. We have compared your full order with the goods invoiced, & after excluding some few Bibles, we have picked out the articles sent without order, amounting to £10.3.7, on which we have credited you 20% dist. = £2.11/-. This we trust will put the matter at rest & prove satisfactory to you. We were sorry to hear of the loss of the Black watch, & that the seed consigned was not insured. We have sent by this mail a copy of our latest Catalogue & hope to be favored with a good order, for the Spring.
