March 7th, 1856.

Sir,

I am certain I never ordered Alexander on Moral Science either from you or any other person. Had you given the date of the entry in your Memorandum Book I could satisfy you that I was not at all in Picton at the time. I received the book in June 1855 on my way to Halifax, — the first time I was in Nova Scotia that year, and you will not surely say that I ordered in June 1854, and that you had not been able to send it in less than 12 months. Had I ordered it I could give my address, and the address of the friend in Charlotte town to whose care it was sent. Mr. Henderson is a worthy Elder in our church, but lays no claim to the title you have given him. I send you the address



to show you that you neither knew  
my name correctly nor the address of  
Mr. Henderson.

The first time I am in Charlotte  
town I shall pay the 2/6 to Hazard and  
Owen, and take their receipt as a  
discharge from you.
