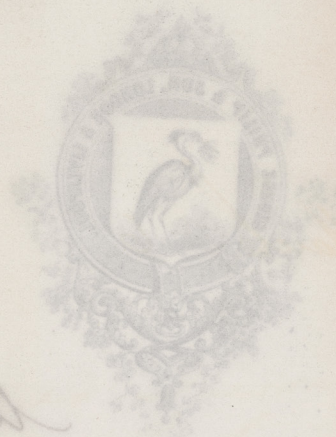


Letter
