Gentlemen,

We have to apologise
for not answering your favour of
the 26th Ult. until this time. The reason
was - there appeared no immediate
necessity for a reply, & that was defer-
ed until we had occasion to write
you notice of sending the usual
monthly parcel - The errors you point
out in the account will be cheerfully
corrected - We regret you should be
at such loss as you show you will
incur with Capell's Monthly parts -
We can assure you we do not gain any
profit by the transaction - We only try to

love ourselves by having other
goods sent with the papers, other-
wise the box would be heavy -
We think we mentioned ~~you~~ the
proportion of expenses charged to you
is rather under, than over your
share. The ~~case~~ case is not analogous,
that you cite, of supplying persons
in the country with seven copies for
the price of six - this price is for single
numbers not monthly parts - off the single
no. there is a larger discount allowed
by the publishers - then there is
no postage in sending them through
the province.
