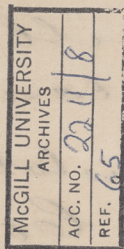


Letter
Miss Murray
27 July 1836



Cambridgeshire P. E. S. July 27th 1836

Dear Sir

You will recollect that I spoke something of securing Calvin's Works, when I was in Pictou. The truth is that a certain Lady, ^{in this congregation} left at her decease the sum of £ 12. Three shillings or £ 8 ster^s to be disposed of at the discretion of the congregation which they have now done and have given it to the Resident Pastor to purchase so far as it will go Calvin's Works. I do not know how much of his writings the above sum will procure. Let us get however his Commentaries on the Scripture. as I have his Institutes if there be money remaining after paying for his Commentaries you better secure his next best works. I am not sure but the Congregation are determined to procure all his works & I do not think you would be running any risk to import them all, for if the Congregation should not take them I think I would do so on my own account. I have thought since its is a congregational matter to send for Mr Pringle's

Translation of Calvin works rather than
to order them in Latin. You will please
to take notice of this. In this case you will
have to apply to the Calvin Translation
Society. However I think that Coombe
publishes for the Society but you will be able
to ascertain the facts. Soon what you told
me when in Pictou I suppose it will make
no difference as to forwarding the money till
I see you next summer. Since the
work is ordered in the way above described
may I ask of you that you will transact
the business upon as liberal terms as is con-
sistent with your trade. The congregation
would like to have the work out this fall
if possible

If it be not imposing upon you may
I ask you to order at the same time the two
following works viz. Dr Wardlaw's "Man Respon-
sible for his Belief" and "The Life of Hugh
Hugh D.D. with a selection from his discourses
by his son in law H. McGill"

I have not received Jacobus yet, nor
have I received the Ev. Review this Spring these
are three nos. now printed which I have not
received.
