Dear Sir,

We regret having to send
you an apology instead of the
usual supply of Capelli's papers.
The "Niagara," that arrived here
on the 15- ult., had our package,
at least there was one entered on
the ship's manifest. Although every
effort was made on our part, the
bundle was not landed - but carried
on to Boston. On the steamer's
arrival yesterday search was
made for the missing package,
without avail. The purser denied
having landed it at Boston but
said he knew nothing about it

And so the matter rests.

It appears we are to be at the
top of goods as there was no
Bile of Lading signed.

We regret disappointing you,
but you will see it is not our
fault, & must beg your patience
untill another supply can be
procured from England.
