P. & O.

Dear Sir - we are glad
with you of 17th Inst. &
regret much the delay
in arrival of your goods -
The order for P. & O. goods
arrived here June 3 and
was shipped by steamer
Napara to Halifax June
27. the first Packet it could
possibly go by - your order
to come in the Home which
you desired to be enclosed
at Whites did not reach
us

until a fortnight after
Whites goods were gone
The Vents offered at the
time for our or other
pleas - the whole of
the order of June 5 & the
pardon was shipped
by the Eagle to Halifax
July 18 - the first ship
after receipt - they left
the July 5 - and might
have gone sooner - we
do not know if your
letters should have
reached us sooner but
you will observe from
the dates given no
unusual time elapsed

with us - Mr Kent say
was only a driver
of the shipment -
About the debt we
write you before of
them as you see fit
