I have heard

have forwarded to you the

without further trouble. They
have omitted to put me up any
wrapping paper (not having any
ready) you would oblige me by
sending at the same time with the
Goods £7.10 to £9 worth of the cheapest
Kinds you can spare (Grey) Please ~~send~~
~~them~~ send it by the same trip as
Cowan's Goods, as it will enable
me to give a Bond for the duties & charges
instead of paying down which will be
something, since they have raised the
duty $\frac{1}{4}$ percent more than usual

I would like another gallon
of Matchless Marrow Sea or any
other large kind, my seeds are
selling well, I want also

Pansy or Peatose
Indian Corn
Long Red Beetle
