

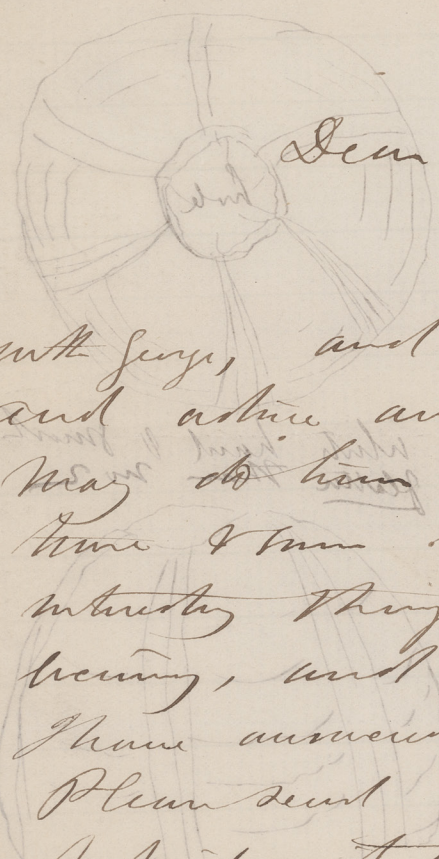

Dear Father,

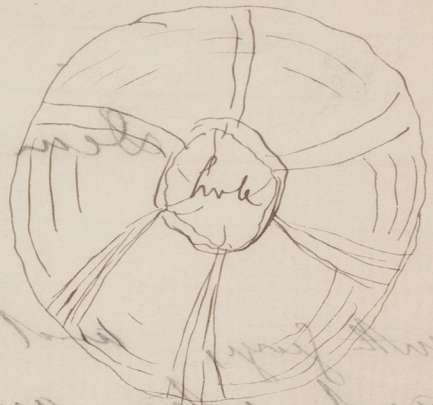
We have very comfortable

 of the sea air.

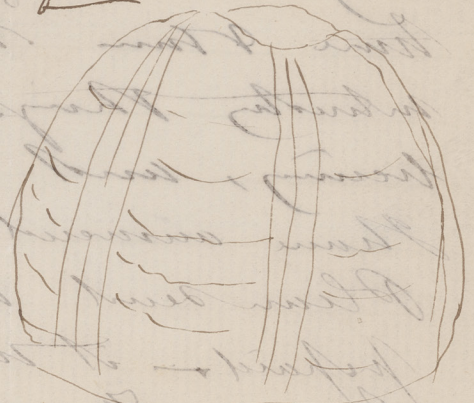
