I deeply regret that Messrs Ormslow should have  
to present a claim to you. They write me by  
said Mr. stating that they had informed you  
of the state of my account, of the remittances  
I had sent them, and also their belief that I

writing which they received a further statement  
of the increase in my sales during the  
Summer months had continued, in proportion  
to what they were at the beginning of the year,  
and as I reasonably anticipated - I would have no  
difficulty now in meeting the claims of all  
my creditors, I owed small amounts to  
Messrs J. R. Bigelow & Co. and to Messrs R. Carter & Bros.  
which I paid in full, and obtained receipts from them  
which I enclose - relieving you from any further  
responsibility on my account, - I next sent  
to my three remaining creditors all the money I  
could command - £30. 5/4. to Messrs Ormslow, -  
£12. 6/0. to Messrs Geo. Philip & Son, and £8. to Messrs W & K  
Chambers - I told them I had used my best en-  
deavours to have their account settled within the  
time mentioned in your guarantee, and hoped
