Jas Dawson Esq
Sir

We received your letter of 3^d Feb. and were sorry to learn by it, that the affair about the small Map of Nova Scotia still remains unsettled, we had hoped that by this time everything would have been made right by the Messrs McRiley. We have had no correspondence with Mr. Hamilton about the Map, nor did we know that you had given him directions to ^{pay} the amount to us. Our own account for 2000 Maps, which we again have an order for last spring, for the work he published has not yet been settled, but that is our own fault as we never received Lyars account, and did not exactly know what to charge him. We hope the thing will soon be arranged to the satisfaction of all parties as it must be annoying to you and the rest of the parties concerned.
