Dear Sir

Mr McVincley wrote me a few days ago he could sell you Union Stock at 3 per cent. I have subsequently sold it in Halifax at 4 $\frac{1}{2}$. The purchaser gets however the benefit of the dividend about to be declared.

Mr Stirling declines to take my transfer without a special Power of Attorney to be lodged in the Bank. I enclose a power for the purpose. If you find any gentleman going to Halifax who could witness your signature and call at the Bank in Halifax and prove it, well - If not get the execution witnessed and certified before a Notary.

Mr. McTherson has asked the price of your water Lot - all in view of himself only -
