- I come to a centre here with a  
great big more or less circular building  
in the middle and I think I have  
found it, then I go on two or three  
blocks and find the very same thing  
only with a great big fountain or  
something in the middle. The streets  
are not marked and it is a little  
hard to navigate. By ~~at~~ living at  
one of the higher buildings, however, it  
would always be possible to pick it out  
by climbing a tree or perhaps asking a

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policeman would be <sup>3</sup> safer.

I'm going to see Montgomery & Stone in "The Old Town" this evening. There is really nothing else to do when one does not know a soul and I have not connected with my customers yet.

I telephoned Mother last night and found that Ken is to be in Toronto this evening so I shall not be able to see him for a week.
