Just to let you see where I am. —

Have left Castport where I did not wear a coat yesterday and am just a few minutes out from St. John.

Castport is one of the greatest places in America for Sardines & Herring. The Bay is alive with them and the fishermen seem still to be working although I'm not sure whether it is just canning and carrying to market that they do just now. I understood a man to say that the clam season would be on soon. The place is alive with sea-gulls. Coming out of the Bay there were miles of them and they seemed as thick as moths round an arc-light.

The scenery is like something I have seen on an old screen. ~~At~~ The tide is so high that a 25 or 30 foot line of rock surrounds the base of every island then a line of sea weed & then evergreen trees. We have had a quiet trip and are just getting in the harbor.
