you dearest -

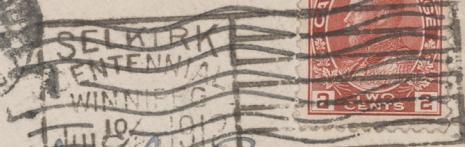
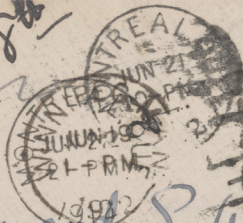
We had quite fun last
