of Jack D'Aeth being

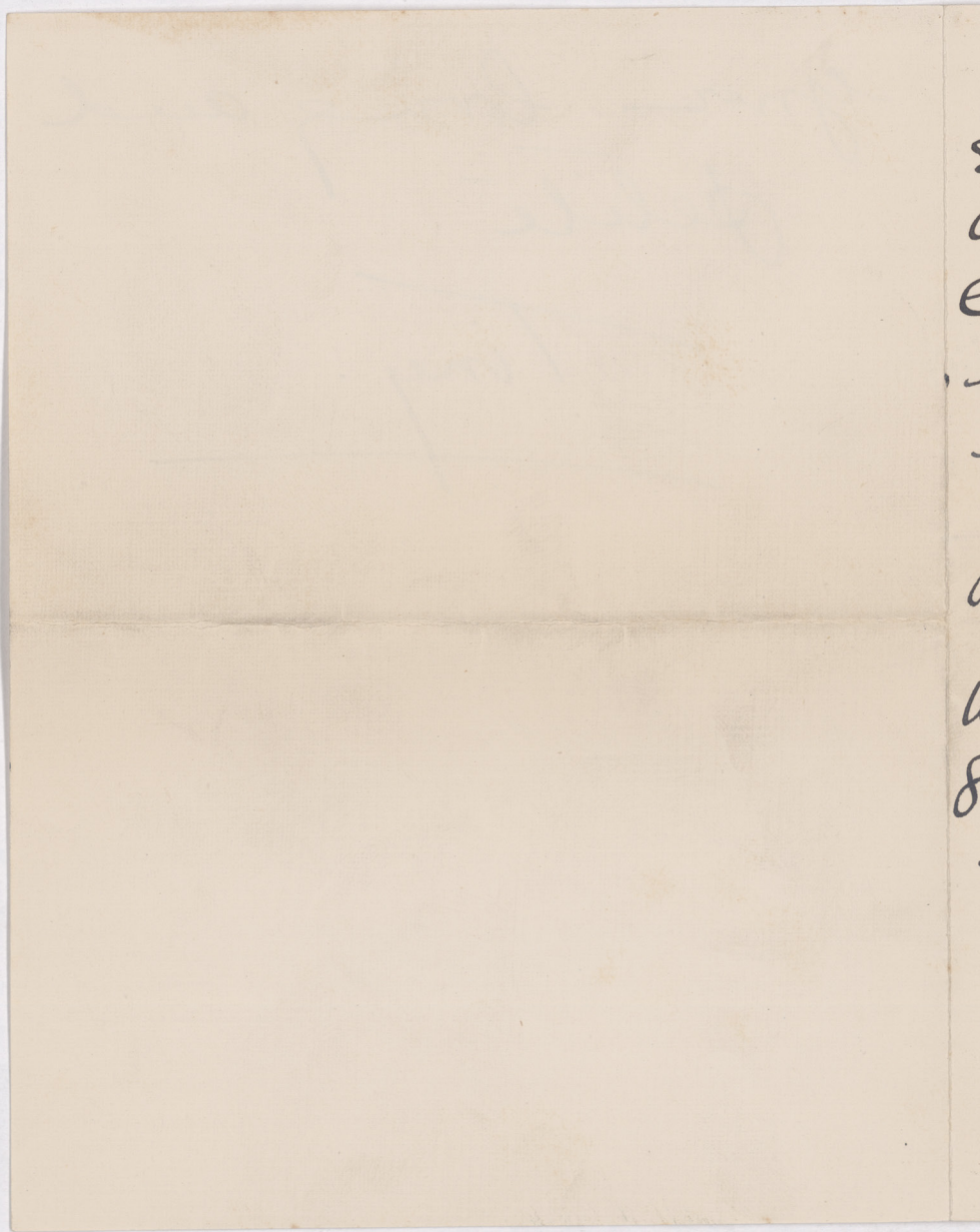

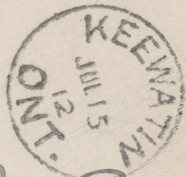
