may go almost anywhere.

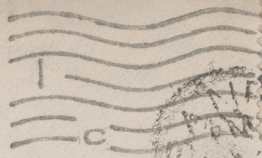
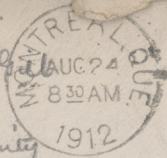
The next one I think I shall
