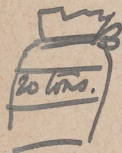

use at once -

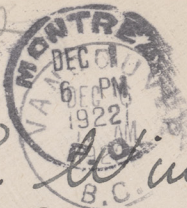

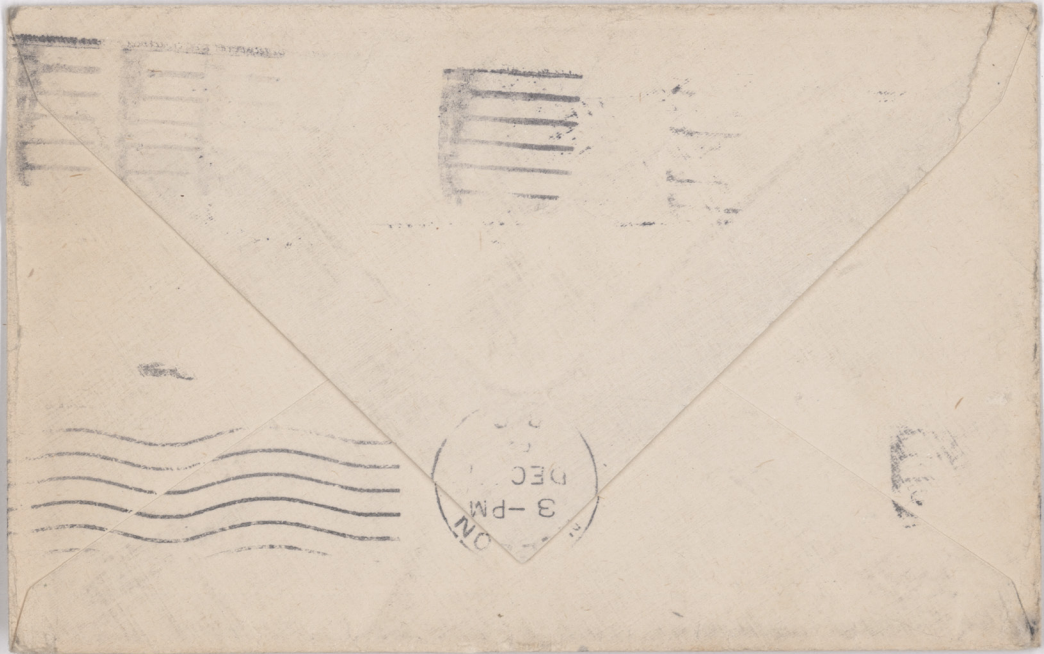
