tonight - I wonder if

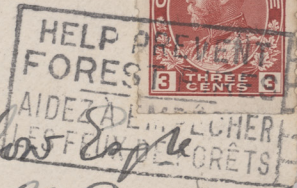
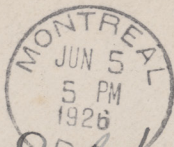
~~A~~ ^y you will notice any
