Enclosed please find a copy of my letter to the Union List of Manuscripts advising them of the change of location of the Logan and McGill Papers.

I have been trying to find more details as to the provenance of the Dawson and Logan Papers. All the accession book has about the Logan Papers is source: D.R. McCord, 1932. As for the Dawson Papers — many of the items came to the Museum from the Dawson Family (no particular member mentioned) via Dr Lighthall, c. 1926—1928. Dr W. Bell Dawson also donated a small number of items. However, as we get further into the McCord Papers in the fall, we might well come up with more specific information. If so, I will notify you.
