 Norway trip ends. We go on to
 Stockholm to night and spend several
 days there before we leave for
 Copenhagen & then I am out sure

whether we will go to Amsterdam or to Berlin but I expect to Amsterdam as Father has seen Berlin before. You must have had a great old storm judging from the accounts you have sent us.

I am so sorry the Norway trip is over for it has been perfectly beautiful and so interesting & new in some respects. Tell Aunt F. I am glad to hear that Vic has got through his exams all O.K.

for he was greatly worried about his results when I last saw him in London. I sail from Liverpool on the 27th Aug. so I have not much longer on this side of the pond. There is nothing much to see here as it is a modern ~~down~~ town in every respect and has a population of 230,000. Father took me to a place called the Sivoli last night to give me an idea of a Continental Beer garden & it was so funny and new



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to me for of course there is nothing like it in America. We have met some awfully nice people during our wanderings + especially to my mind Dr + Mrs Clark from Philadelphia they were both so nice + so full of fun. We saw an old Viking ship yesterday which is supposed to have been in use during the ninth century and was found lately buried in a clay pit near here it was so interesting + curious + I would not have missed seeing it for anything. + after is out seeing some Professor or somebody + buying minerals so I am taking the time here to write several letters while I have the

chance to for when we are on the
 move chances come far & few
 between. We have had two
 beautiful days here & it is most
 enjoyable after the week of rainy
 weather we have just had. Father
 has brought a lot of beautiful
 photographs which should give you
 all a good idea of Norway &
 its fjords etc. I hope to stay over
 at Metis for a couple of days
 but it all depends on what sort
 of a passage I have over for
 if it is bad I won't have time I am
 afraid. I am sorry you have had
 such a wet summer but it can't be
 helped. Thank Eva for her letter.
 Remember me to the lunch
 at Metis. I don't know when
 father is coming over but I
 expect some time in the middle
 of September or thereabouts. Must
 close now so lots of love to all
