H.W.F. & C.X. Spring Tides rise 6 feet - Neaps 4 ft.
Their diurnal inequality at times causes a difference of 2 hours
in the two tides of the same day and of two feet in their height.

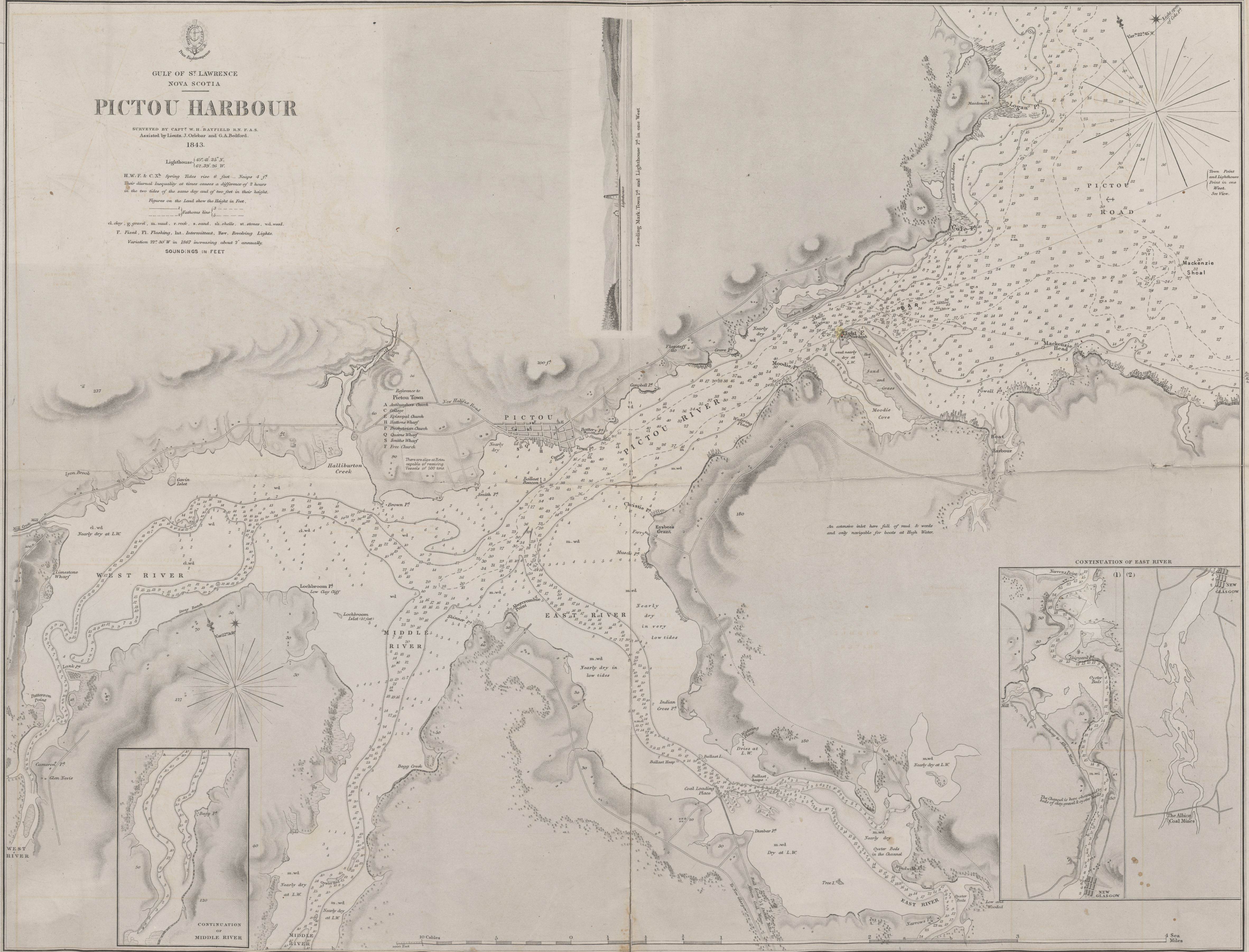

Variation 22° 30' W in 1867 increasing about 2' annually.

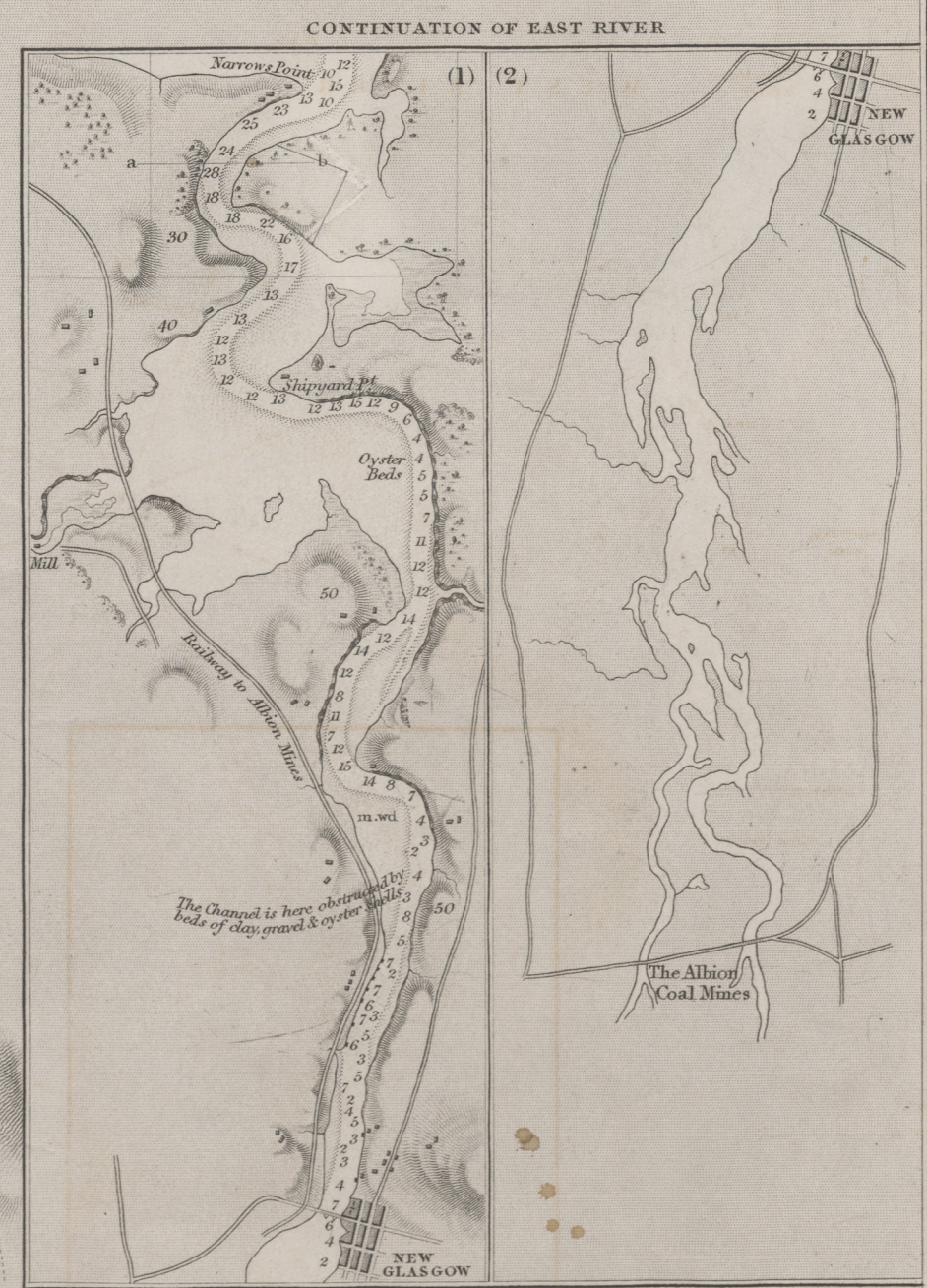
SOUNDINGS IN FEET
