In answer
to your letter of June 23,
I beg leave to say that
I am quite willing to
undertake the analyses
of Piton and you require;
though I may perhaps
be unable to complete
them in less than two
or three weeks.

I shall send to
Mr Poole ~~and~~ for
the samples, and shall

attend particularly to
the points you mention,
and to anything else
that may occur in
the process and that
may be useful.

You may remember
that at Colson's L., Mr
Henderson told us of Iron
ore found at North R.
Lake. A man from that
place brought me lately
a piece of specular Iron
and says that there
are "great rocks" of it

Projecting from the ground
there. I have lately
received some very small
specimens of copper &
iron ore quite similar to
those of Polson's from
the Ludlowberry hills.
They are not however
I believe within your
jurisdiction and are
very likely from veins too
small to be useful.

Before I left for Boston
I sent you a copy of
Harrington's plan. I have
not yet heard anything

respecting your success
in getting a man to
go to Polaris
