

Paris August 11. 1849

My dear Sir

I have been applied to by
our friends in Halifax to know what
they will do with Boxes of Clothing &c.
for our Missions, and I have a few
of some fine Cloth myself, and as you
have generally superintended their de-
partments I wish to give to you the favour of
your informing me what I shall say to
them and what I shall do myself.

My Mr. Zullock called on me yesterday
and I referred him to you, he goes to
Pictou soon and will call on you
and to him you can say what the A. P.

friends should do -

Will you oblige me by paying
the Jennings' Church Bill. My Brother
now by my side says that all! all!
Donald told him ab about 2 years
that if we fund him 20% for 2 yrs
it would do - you will please
pay the Bill whenever it may be
so that I may put it in my Budget
about to be rendered. -

Will you have the goodness to acknow-
ledge for me Five pounds from the
Ladies

grove Church Halifax - and £2. 3. 0 $\frac{1}{2}$
from the Monthly Missionary Prayer
Meeting Society Musquodoboits
after correspondence

with you on the subject we agreed to
close my accounts for the last 2 years
on the 1st September. I think that
we had better do the same this, so
that I may be able to present to the
Church the doings of a full financial
year. You can go on with publishing
the Reports, so that my accounts
may come out in the 1st Church
after 1st Sept.

My Brother desires me to say
that so soon as he returns that his
Reports will be sent to you.
