A. G. Archibald Esq,

Dear Sir

I observe in the Boston Journal of Sept 24, an advertisement in which extracts from my report given to C. D. Archibald Esq Yourself and others in 1846, are paraded as a guarantee for the lands of the "Londonderry Mining Company"

If I understood you when in Turro last, the lots of land to which that report primarily refers, are not now in the possession of the "L. M. C.". If this be the case, it is evident that the agents of that Company are making a very improper use of my name, and are acting unfairly both to the present owners

of the property and of the American
public.

In these circumstances I think
it is your duty to demand back
the report from Pop or the Halifax
Directors or whoever may be responsible,
and to warn them against making
any further use of it.

When I saw ~~the letter~~ ~~ad-~~
~~vertisement~~, I ~~thought~~ ^{at first} of writing to
the editor and stating what I knew
of the facts. On ~~second~~ thoughts how-

to Pop without my knowledge or
consent, and as I am not personally
