My dear Sir

Enclosed you will find
notes of last meeting of Board -
I read the extracts, ^{of your letter} relative to the
appointments of my Brother to the
Editorship. By the notes you will
see what was done.

I thank you for the trouble that you
took in writing me in the subject of
the Meeting. I might have been there

at some success had it not been for
your views with which you so kindly
furnish me. I don't altogether understand Messrs
McCulloch & Pop - and wait for the report
of ^{Mr. P.} his speech to enlighten me - I hope that
nothing will be done by you and our other
friends to obstruct the movement, having
for their object the establishing a theological
seminary properly so called - An official
institution of that kind is certainly required
to sustain our position as a Church, and
what we discussed you may have heard about
before. I hope it will not be allowed to
interfere with theology - I think it hardly
fair to talk about Mr. Pop. being obliged
to touch so many things, because the thing
is only in embryo, and when arranged we

mentioned I suppose that it is the intention to
engage more teachers -

I conversed with Mr. Boston on the
subject of both your last letters in reference to
Miss May's business -

You will see that it is the intention
to have a meeting very near you side of the
mountain - where you will have an opportunity
to press your views in reference to the gradual
distribution of the Register -
