My Dear Sir,

I herewith inclose £20

Money which has come into my hands;
the particulars of which I will give you
again, Also Mr^s Campbell's account of his
collections which comes too late for in-

number of the "Register". The Money
he did not forward but acknowledges

and wishes it to be acknowledged in the
Register exactly as in his enclosed ac-
count.
