Gentlemen;

In answer
to yours of March 16,
I beg to say that I
thank you for your kind
help in sending the samples
of cloth. I prefer
the blue no 2, and
green no 4 (samples enclosed)
and would like half
in each, to suit different
tastes. Which you may
get the prop. die of Fig 33
and stamp it in gold.
It will improve the

appearance and increase
the sale sufficiently to
pay the expense.

In addition to the
hints in my last, I may
mention that if it does
not increase the cost,
I would like the books
bound in strong triple or
tape fastened to the
boards. I trust to you
to select a handsome
pattern for the cover
and to have it neatly stamped.

If, acting on the suggestion
in my last, you print

on post or crown octavo
five, and a broader board
is required, I shall pay the
difference if any. In any case,
give a board sufficiently large.

I mailed the proof
by last steamer and
trust it has reached
you.

I thank you for
your attention to the
ms from Webster, and
to the map. The proof
of the latter I shall
look for by mail due
this week. I shall

attend to what you say
about advertising, and
shall write on this by
next morning when I return
the last proof.
