My dear Dawson

I shall take care if I have another edition of the Elements a year or two hence to refer to the corrections which you have suggested & some of them, such as the recently buried trees in Nova Scotia at a point to which you took me, shall be referred to with the illustration in the work now in hand, <sup>the Principles</sup> & I shall always be thankful for any farther suggestions of yours.

I should also be very glad if you could tell me how far in the Northern Hemisphere you have any evidence of the extension of the Devonian or Carboniferous flora towards the pole.

The Miocene plants in Iceland Greenland etc show a warm tertiary climate very far north & any evidence that you may know whether

from plants or animals implying a warmer climate than the present in arctic regions will be welcome as I am treating of Mr. Croll's discussion in the Philosophical Magazine of August 1864 in which he maintains a periodical recurrence of glacial periods in consequence of the extremes of eccentricity to which the earth's orbit is liable.

June 5<sup>th</sup>

It is nearly two months since I began this letter & now I am just starting for Germany & the Alps & shall be absent nearly three months but always glad to hear from you by letters addressed to London when you have time. He shall be accompanied by our nephew aged 16 who I hope ~~they~~ will learn much German & Geology of which last he is very fond.

I hope Canada is recovering now that the

American war is over & there will not be much  
money wasted by us & you in fortifications  
against the Great Republic
