My dear Dr. Dawson

I have received your letter of
the 28th April. I know that two notices
were sent out by Myrm and somewhat
has told me I hoped they would get out
in time for the Convocation. They might
however not reach until just a
day after the fact.

In July or just in September
I am not likely to find geologists
at home, not in one of these months
more than another. I am informed
by Ramsay that the British Assoc-
iation meets in Birmingham, and
that the month is September, but
nobody seems to know the exact day.

From three independent sources
I understand that the expense
of the trip you propose with
the view of visiting the locality
of volcanoes, glaciers & fossil
man would be £1. per day
with the addition of what it
might cost to go direct to
Malta visiting Gibraltar
on the way, which the bone
caverns are attracting much
attention. Rensley is to be
sent this year to make a
paleontological examination of

Subaltan for the Government.
Believe that the cost of
a passage to Malta is from
£15. to £20.

I am told that in travelling
on the Continent you should take
second not first class cars. Only
princes & proud Englishmen
take first class & they pay
dear for the same. You
should take up your quarters
in the best hotels. They are in
the end the cheapest. In the
second rate hotels you have
much dirt & much impertinence

& consequent discomfort &
increased expenditure.

I suppose you got the
Intellectual Observer for May
which I sent by the last post
from Dr Carpenter and that
you were pleased with his
article on Eozoon. It is
proposed that Dr Carpenter
should give us a description
of the fossil with full illustrations
of all its parts & plates to show
those parts of other foraminifera
fossil & recent, which make it
understood - to appear as a decade
of our Survey. Yours truly
