to be returned, I would  
attend to this.

Your large Thrinax  
is evidently T. Canadensis,  
a species which I did  
not before know from  
N. Sutton. If you can  
get more, a specimen

would be very acceptable

The sturpote is all  
something new to me  
is, evidently identical  
with Solaster ~~not~~ eudecta  
of Europe, a species I have  
not seen before from Nova  
Scotia, though it is common  
in Maine.

I am glad that  
you take notice of these  
sturpotes. We shall soon  
have quite a list from  
Nova Scotia.
