My dear Sir

After sending to you a copy of my article on the flora of Acadia I discovered that the printer beside making a number of typographical errors, had through some oversight misplaced about half dozen pages of the manuscript, and thus destroyed the connection of some parts of the article.

I enclose herewith a list of errata which will make it more intelligible. It would gratify me to have it inserted in the Naturalist - or circulated with the next number.

map which are the property of
the Natural History Society here!

In a letter which I wrote
to you some time ago I gave
a general view of the Devonian
rocks in Charlotte County for
comparison with those of Gaspé.
It may be that the Nerepis
granites classified there as a
lower division of the Devonian
series may be only accidentally
connected with it. The two upper
divisions only can be spoken of
as certainly Devonian or Siluro-
Devonian. I have written a
letter to Dr. Hunt bearing upon

the relations of this formation
which may be of interest to you.

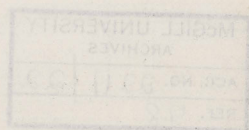
A young friend inquired
