Prof. Lind has sent me a copy  
of his map with sections showing

His idea of the distribution of the  
supposed Laurentian "Arsonian" &  
Silurian, in the vicinity of Halifax &  
Windsor. His determination appears  
to be based chiefly on mineral &  
lithological characters which, when  
unsupported by the evidence of organic  
remains, or by very careful stratigraphic  
mapping, are not I think to be depended  
on. I am not aware whether the  
work he is doing is on his own account  
or on behalf of the N. S. Government.



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Certainly think it would be desirable that  
his investigation should if possible be carried  
on in connection with the Dominion Geol.
