My dear Dr. Dawson

Referring to your letter of the 8th Inst
and to our Conversation yesterday on the proposed
publication of figures and descriptions of your Devonian
plants, I beg to say that I fully concur in all you suggest
respecting it; including the estimate which you give
of the probable cost. — Unless you are entirely satisfied
with what Burland's Artist can do, I think it would
be best to employ Reinhardt^{old}, and not run the risk of
sacrificing the quality of the work to save lightly five
dollars. The difference in the price they respectively charge.
Mr. Smith the survey Artist has just now more work than
he can well get through. He is unfortunately very
constantly so in well as to be altogether disabled.
I return you, enclosed your 2^d L^t. Introductory pages

and the specimens leaf showing the style of the description
your proposal to give.

Thank you for the note on the examination you have kindly made
of the ^{kind} specimen of rock which I left at your house on the 9th.
It is a most interesting and important determination.
