No liability is assumed for errors in cypher or obscure messages; nor for any error or neglect by any other Company over whose lines this message may be sent to reach its destination, and this Company is hereby made the agent of the sender of this message to forward it over the lines extending beyond those of this Company. No agent or employee is allowed to vary these terms, or make any other or verbal agreement, nor any promise as to the time of performance, and no agent or Superintendent is authorized to make a special agreement for insurance.
