Florida coming back to
Cleveland, perfectly well
about Day 1st Immediately

was taken with typhoid
fever, and for a month was very
sick. She is now better and I

left her and came here
a week ago. —

From the brief letters you
will learn why you have
heard nothing from me
for so long a time, and
why I have not before thanked
you for your very valuable
and interesting volume on
the Devonian Flora —

I am afraid it will not
be easy for you to get a copy
of Hayden's *Yellowstone* report
so I send you a duplicate
which I have. I had
torn out my paper on
Fossil Plants, & put it

among my papers on
Fossil Botany, but you
can lend it in again

In justice to myself
I should say that this
paper is part only of
a much larger report
which I prepared for
Capt Reynolds some
years since - With
other things it contained
the description of fossil
plants, - subsequently pub-
lished with Annals of
N. Y. Lyceum, and
I believe sent to you

28. 46 plates, accompanied
them & acceptant. They are
not yet published - -

You will see that many
