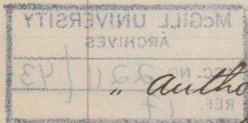

The accounts are due on the first days of the School Quarters, viz :—Sept. 1st, Nov. 16th, Feb. 1st, and April 16th ; and are for bills or other legal tender.

The number of scholars being strictly limited, a quarter's notice, or a quarter's payment, is required previously to the removal of a pupil. The quarters are not divided.

The School fees are FIFTEEN DOLLARS PER QUARTER, if guaranteed for the year : but for any shorter period, an ADDITIONAL THREE DOLLARS PER QUARTER is charged. There is no reduction in the case of boys who do not attend during the full hours, or who do not study particular subjects. But boys under ten years of age in the JUNIOR CLASS are charged at the rate of TEN DOLLARS PER QUARTER, if guaranteed for the year ; with an ADDITIONAL TWO DOLLARS per quarter, for any shorter period.

School-books will be furnished at the current prices ; or, if desired, they may be lent to the pupils, and a charge made according to the amount of use. A fixed yearly charge is made, for ordinary stationery, and the use made of school furniture, &c.
