or donations, rent a suitable build-
-ing in the suburbs. & commence
as soon as sufficient funds
are realized, then with a work-
-ing Instⁿ however small, ask
at head quarters for the means
necessary to place on a permanent
foundation an Instⁿ for the
accomodation for all of suitable
age ~~and~~ in your province, similar
to our State Instⁿs
